



Professor Dan Haydon

Elected Academic Staff Member

Dan Haydon is Professor of Population Ecology and Epidemiology in the School of Biodiversity, One Health and Comparative Medicine. He acquired degrees from the University of Southampton (BSc), University of Texas at Austin (PhD) and undertake postdoctoral research at the Universities of Oxford, British Columbia, Edinburgh, and Guelph (Ontario). He have served in various capacities on a range of university-level bodies including the Research Planning and Strategy Committee, the Sustainability Working Group (co-Chair), as a member of Senate, and as Director of the Glasgow Centre for International Development, and founding Director of the Boyd Orr Centre for Population and Ecosystem Health (that went on to win a Queen's Anniversary Prize in 2013).

Within the College of Medical, Veterinary and Life Sciences, he served on the Equality, Inclusion & Diversity Committee, and on the College Management Group as Director of the former Institute of Biodiversity, Animal Health, and Comparative Medicine for twelve years. Within this Institute he chaired the Athena Swan Self-Assessment Team, overseeing three successful submissions. He is a previous winner of the Zoological Society of London's Science Medal and was elected to the Royal Society of Edinburgh in 2008.
