

## UPPER INTERMEDIATE LEVEL

This Chinese upper intermediate course is designed for those with previous experience and knowledge at the intermediate course level, and students should be able to communicate freely about basic topics taught in the beginner and intermediate levels. The course will introduce 446 new words and expressions, some complex sentence structures and more Chinese culture.
