

Child Soldiers: Protection and Rehabilitation

This one day conference is aimed at legal and therapeutic professionals who work with traumatised children involved in asylum proceedings, in particular those children who have been forcibly recruited as child soldiers. It offers the opportunity to explore the different roles and remit of lawyers and therapists in this process and the particular challenges facing practitioners.

The objective of the conference is to provide an over-arching view of the applicable therapeutic and legal framework of the process, with concrete examples of cases, to encourage understanding between the professions of the issues of traumatised children being assessed for expert reports and giving evidence in legal proceedings.

The presentations will deal with both domestic and international perspectives on this challenging phenomenon. Delegates will gain insight into the issues affecting child soldiers, the therapeutic input and use of experts' reports, as well as the processes of the legal arena.

We hope this dialogue will promote greater understanding of the difficulties that such children face and facilitate constructive professional links between these often disparate perspectives of the legal and therapeutic worlds.

Applications from those who are deaf or hard of hearing are welcome.
